## Key Verses

<sup>14</sup> As for me, may I never boast about anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. Because of that cross, my interest in this world has been crucified, and the world's interest in me has also died. <sup>15</sup> It doesn't matter whether we have been circumcised or not. What counts is whether we have been transformed into a new creation. <sup>16</sup> May God's peace and mercy be upon all who live by this principle; they are the new people of God. Galatians 6:14-16 NLT

## Quick Study

#### Choose the questions that will lead you and/or your group into reflection and discussion:

- 1. As you reflect on Christina's message, what personally encouraged you? What challenged you?
- 2. Galatians 6 open with a familial greeting. Whom in your "spiritual family" do you admire or appreciate for the way they live out their faith? How has their life and faith made yours better or stronger?
- 3. Galatians 6:6 encourages us to generously share our lives. Are you re-investing in the family of God? If so, what blessings are you experiencing? If not, how can you begin using your faith or your spiritual gifts to bless others?
- 4. Jesus gave everything to secure our freedom. Now, we must stay free.
  - a. In what area of your life are you ready to take ground [fight, hold fast, resist] SO THAT you don't return to striving, but stand firm in your freedom? This is NOT about perfection, but rather progress.
  - b. Read Galatians 6:9. Taking ground takes energy. What are some things you do to hold on to faith when you're growing weary? These could be personal, practical or spiritual.
  - c. Make a game plan. Write down the truths you want to remember, the people you will turn to and the progress you've made so that when you get tired, you don't give up!

## Cultivating a life in Christ

#### Respond to God, inviting Him to cultivate this week's truth into your life.

Cultivating a life in Christ is an active, intentional process in progress. Every day we choose to exchange law for life, bondage for freedom and performance for promise. ### Dig Deeper

### Choose any of these dig deeper opportunities to cultivate more of God's word into your life.

- Read Galatians 6:4-5 MSG. Investment in others must be preceded by self-awareness. How do these verses instruct us to become the best version of who God created us to be? What two "don'ts" do they warn us against?
- Read 2 Corinthians 5:18-21 NLT. God uses us to give others the gift of grace. What is a meaningful and practical way that you could share God's grace and goodness with someone around you? This could be an act of service, a word of hope or even an invitation to spend time with you. Be Christ's ambassador and give away grace.
